## How can past research in the Limestone Coast influence future grapegrowing in the region?

### Background

A significant body of research, largely funded by producers, has been conducted across the Limestone Coast over the past 30 or so years. This information is of value when assessing future research/extension opportunities in the region but is not easily accessible.

### Why is it important?

A desktop survey will provide Limestone Coast levy-payers with a summary of viticultural/winemaking research conducted in their region. The adoption of the 'Unearthing Viticulture' document (created 2010-12) by winemakers/viticulturists across the Limestone Coast and beyond gives an indication of why it is important to have local, relevant information collated in such a way that people can easily access.

### What would success look like?

The primary output from this project is a document that summarises research and field trial results conducted in the Limestone Coast region. Publication of the document on the Limestone Coast Grape and Wine Council website and others will provide a resource for producers in the region and inform future local research.
